## BOWEN'S RIDGE CEMETERY

Inventory made 4 Jan 1964 by James Logan Morgan

"This cemetery, which appears on some maps as the 'Briar Fork Cemetery', is located at Briar Fork, a point where two roads joined. The cemetery is located in either the northeast corner of the southeast quarter or the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of **section 15**, in township 10 north, range 2 west. The spelling of John Boen's name is the correct spelling of the family name. However, the designation of the area as 'Boen's Ridge' has appeared very rarely in Jackson County records. **The cemetery is located on the north and south sides of a country road which runs east into Arkansas Highway 145.**"

*near intersection Jackson Cty 33 W and Ark 145  
3 miles east and 1 mile south of Auvergne Ark*

Bowen's Ridge, both parts of the Bowen's Ridge Cemetery, and Burton Cemetery are shown on Tilton Quadrangle, Arkansas, edition of 1956, N3515-W9100/15. Scale of Tilton Quadrangle is 1:62,500 with 5' contour intervals.

In "The Roads of Arkansas" 1990, Shearer Publishing, these cemeteries are shown but not named, only a single icon indicates Bowens Ridge cemetery. Scale is 1" equals 2.0 miles

I walked thru these cemeteries, took GPS locations, and a few photos on Friday, Feb 6 and again on Saturday Feb 7, 2009.

The high point of the north section of Bowen's Ridge Cemetery is at **N35° 29.794' W91° 10.613'**  
GPS indicated an elevation of 240' and of the gravel road on east side as 227'

The north part is off the paved highway 145, west of the Locust Creek crossing, and adjacent to a well maintain, gravel road. An electrical power line and a dirt road are on the south side of the north section. There is a small house at west end of the road and power line. The Ridge is prominent, maybe 15' higher than the road and is the north end of Bowen's Ridge. The cemetery is closely mowed, clear, and clean. There are several graves that have been added in just the last few years, almost no markers are on the peak of the ridge where I would expect the earliest graves to be. I didn't count grave makers, but could easily be 40 or 50.

Two that had recent care were:  
Hosey Anthony 1889-1959 WWI and  
Less Anthony 1893-1959 WWI.

These were beside the dirt road in SW corner of this part of the cemetery.  
One above ground crypt, in poor condition : Herman Hezkeas Murphy 1898-1932.

**The south part of Bowen's Ridge Cemetery** is some 200 to 300 yards SSE of the larger, well maintained north part. This part adjoins the west side of the creek. Although the clear north part is in plain sight from here, conditions are much different. This part is nearly lost, it is heavily grown over and not maintained. I found only three grave markers and part of a small concrete structure that probably had nothing to do with the graves. Two of the three markers have toppled and are on the ground.

I photographed and tied red surveyors tape to first marker which is at:

South maybe 20 to 30 feet is a small sunken stone. All I could make out was:

*On a much earlier visit to Newport Library, I saw a note in the 1964 Inventory of Bowens Ridge by James Logan Morgan that indicated Eliza Burns Simmons was buried at Bowens Ridge. She lived from 1798 until after 1870, was wife of Holman Freeman Simmons 1798-before 1870 and mother of Holman Felix Simmons 1824-1893, Joseph Bibbs Simmons 1831-after 1906, and Mary Ella Simmons Mallory 1833-1882 who are buried in Sand Hill Cemetery..*
