Her youngest two sons were born while she lived in Millington, Tn. While in Conway, Carolyn completed her Master of Elementary Education degree at the University of Central Arkansas., preparing her for a lifetime devoted to educating elementary students.

Her daughters-in-law were often the recipient of her helping hand when little ones were inconsolable and only Grandmother's soft voice and gentle rocking could calm them.

Our lives were deeply blessed because of her.
