For over half of a century, Mary zealously researched her family history.

She was a member of the Twickenham Town Chapter DAR, the Jamestowne Society and other patriotic and lineage organizations. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Huntsville.

Survivors are her daughter, Mary Irene Makima Ross and son-in-law, Lester M. Ross, Senior of Huntsville; and her sister, Lillian Rogers, of Birmingham.

She was predeceased by her husband of 56 years George Henry Makima; her parents, Attorney William Hampton Shaw and Marguerite Eliza Simmons Shaw of Tuscumbia; and six siblings.
