WOODS, Jno. H. - Died, two miles east of Bentonville at his home, Nov. 19th, 1904, Jno. H. Woods, in the 45th year of his age. The deceased was born in Benton county, Ark. July 11th, 1860. His whole life was spent in this and adjoining communities. He accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior in his boyhood and united with the C.P. Church. Dec. 23rd, 1899 he was elected and ordained a ruling elder in Woods' congregation, which office he faithfully filled to the utmost of his ability and to the satisfaction of the church. WUNDER, Mary Isabella ASHWORTH - Mrs. I.S. Wunder died Sunday morning at half-past seven o'clock at her home in this city. Her death had been hourly expected for a day or two by the family and doctors, but a great many of our people did not know her condition was considered so serious and the news of her death came as a great surprise to them. Mrs. Wunder was taken ill with typhoid fever the first day of September. Complications arose soon that made the case a dangerous one and though several times she seemed on the road to recovery it was only temporary.
