

JUDGE LEON LIPPMAN Little Rock Ark March 29 1911.

Judge Leon Lippman, one of the best known lumbermen died at his home at Tupelo Jackson a week ago last Friday after a brief illness. A chill, brought on pneumonia and Judge Lippman lived just one week after becoming ill.

The funeral took place the following day the remains interred in an Augusta cemetery. Judge Lippman was born in France but came to America at 11 years of age his parents settling in Pennsylvania. At the outbreak of the Civil War the family moved to Illinois. Judge Lippman joined the Union army and served four years. At the close of the war Judge Lippman came to in Arkansas, settling in Jackson county.

He operated mills in Tuckerman, Olyphant, Swifton, Tupelo and Simmon's Switch. He was at one time county and probate judge of Jackson county and the the returns showed he was elected State Senator at another time, but a change was made and though he contested the State Central Democratic Committee, he was defeated.

Judge Lippman is survived by his wife, a son, Allie Lippman who is postmaster at Augusta, and two daughters, Mrs Marshall Patterson of Augusta and Mrs Walter Lewis of Colorado Springs. The deceased was 88 years of age.
